**\*Bears –** Three bears were moved from Marineland to a sanctuary due to cramped conditions and adequate water availability.

- Sasha, a male bear, was moved and was formally adopted in November 2022.
- The two female bears, named Maple and Sugar, were moved in February 2023.

**# Cetacean –**

- Five belugas (Jetta, Sahara, Havok, Havana, Kharabali) sold for research and moved in May 2021. All the whales had pre-existing health conditions at the time of purchase.

Havok was sedated 5 times for the transfer. He was 5 years old and underweight at the time of death, in August 2021.

Havana died February 2022.

Kharabali died December 2023.

- Kiska the orca, at Marineland since 1979, she had 5 calves that all died young. Kiska she died March 10, 2023 of a bacterial infection. The full necropsy report was never released.
- Eighteen belugas and one dolphin whose names are not known have died at Marineland since 2019.
- Eos 7 years old beluga sick since birth was euthanized in February 2025.

**~ Deer –** On opening day in May 2019, two deer died in a stampede. Today's exact number is unknown, with significant concern for housing and welfare.

**+ Penguins –** Two penguins died in August of 2024 at Marineland. Nine Magellanic penguins were shipped from Marineland in December 2024. They are reported to be doing well as of August 2025.

**@ Walruses –** Two walruses, a mother and calf, removed and shipped to a different site in March 2023.
